SENIOR STAFF REVIEW PROCESS/TIMELINE

GOALS OF THE HNJ2030 SENIOR STAFF

Senior Staff Action Plan Reviewing Guidelines:

- 1. Action plan teams are volunteers from the private sector, academia, non-profits and state and local government who are experts in their respective fields
- 2. Action plan recommendations should align with ongoing/upcoming DOH initiatives
- 3. Raise any concerns about feasibility, including resource allocation
- 4. Plans may not cover every aspect of a particular topic area or DOH agenda, but reviewers should note critical gaps
- 5. Each team has considered potential overlaps with other state agency plans, e.g., Nurture NJ and DOT's Strategic Highway Safety Plan; in some instances, redundancy serves as emphasis on particular public health goals
